To ensure the continued growth and success of the Finnish economy, we need to create more successful startups. Finland needs at least 100 new startups generating more than 100 million euros in revenue. Universities play a critical role in this process.

Many of the fastest-growing tech startups, such as Smartly.io, Wolt, and Swappie, have emerged from student-run Entrepreneurship Societies. These societies will keep having a critical role in enabling new high-potential startups, and they need the universities' support to thrive.

Research-driven startups are another critical area for universities to back. Many successful companies, such as IQM, Relex, and Iceye, were created by commercializing research conducted in universities.

The most effective way for creating new startups in any university is through a combination of a viable startup community and strong collaboration with research teams. Strong research capabilities with a focus on commercialization create a solid foundation for building new companies.

I believe that the biggest potential for commercializing research lies in creating startups.

2 Entrepreneurship Societies

An Entrepreneurship Society is a student-driven non-profit organization that serves as the voice of entrepreneurship in universities. All events and programs are related to two topics: 1. Inspiration and 2. Building startups.

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History of Entrepreneurship Societies

Finland is home to 34 higher education institutions, where student culture is strongly built by a student-to-student mentality. This means that students are the primary organizers of most student activities.

In 2009 a group traveled to San Francisco & Silicon Valley to learn about how local students run entrepreneurial activities. Upon their return to Finland, they were instructed to take action instead of writing any reports. Inspired by their experiences abroad, they founded the first student-driven Entrepreneurship Society called Aalto Entrepreneurship Society.





History of Entrepreneurship Societies


A few years later, students from other universities took notice of what Aaltoes was doing and were inspired to establish their own local Entrepreneurship Societies. As of 2023, there are now 18 active Entrepreneurship Societies in almost every university or university of applied sciences in Finland. The majority of these organizations are volunteer-based and non-profit, run by students who are responsible for organizing startup activities in their universities.

Over the past 15 years, Entrepreneurship Societies have organized more than 5,000 events and programs related to startup entrepreneurship. These societies have played a significant role in the growth of the Finnish startup ecosystem. Today, many of the most successful startups in Finland, such as Wolt, Veri, and Smartly.io, have deep connections within Entrepreneurship Societies.



Student-driven Startup Accelerator Programs

The most efficient way to create new, world-changing startups is to match student founders with the best mentors who can guide them. Almost every educational institution has its own startup accelerator program to boost new startups.



Forward by LUTES is a one-week-long startup accelerator program. Teams spend one week in cottages with mentors and workshop hosts who help startups refine their ideas, making them ready for the market.



Ignite by **Aaltoes** is a 10-week-long summer accelerator for student-driven startups.

During the program participants get:

- Unique skills and knowledge about entrepreneurship
- Access to a broad network of entrepreneurs, coaches, and like-minded people
- 10 university credits
- Financial support



HELSEED by **Helsinki Think Company**

is a student entrepreneurship program that is open to students with a new business idea, as well as more advanced startup teams. The program includes workshops that focus on various areas of entrepreneurship.



Startup Journey Accelerator Boost is

an early-stage startup accelerator that takes place every summer. The goal of the program is to enable teams to take a huge step forward in their startup's early development.



Discovery Tuesday is a

five-week-long accelerator program with the goal of taking every participant from idea to startup.



Other Exciting Entrepreneurship Programs

Every event organized by Entrepreneurship Societies falls under one of two categories: 1. Building a startup and 2. Inspiration about entrepreneurship.

Here are some cool events and programs from different Entrepreneurship Societies.

SILTA

Silta by Aaltoes is a program for early-stage startups who will spend three months in Silicon Valley to find investors and customers and build their startups there.

Entrepreneurial Insight Week

Entrepreneurial Insight Week is a student internship program by HankenES. It provides students with the opportunity to work for a week with the most promising startups in Helsinki.

PIXELS 3

Pixels3 by PoriES is an event focused on game development, aiming to showcase key players doing interesting and innovative work and provide educational content related to the gaming industry.



*ship Startup Festival is a unique platform for early-stage startups and people interested in entrepreneurship. It's the biggest event about entrepreneurship in Eastern Finland. *ship brings together more than 400 curious people

UNFOLD

Unfold is a hackathon where students work to solve societal and environmental problems. Many social science students have learned that entrepreneurship can be a viable solution for addressing these issues.

Personal Experience

I was first introduced to Slush during a LUTES Community hangout where the word Slush was unfamiliar to me. However, after four years in the startup ecosystem, I have become knowledgeable about Slush's purpose.

Organizational Roles

As one of the primary coordinators of LUTES' accelerator program, Forward, in 2020, and later as LUTES' Chairperson with a focus on community self-development, I realized the extent of my capabilities and responsibilities as an active member.

Learnings

Through involvement with LUTES, I learned to take risks and not fear failure while gaining valuable experience. Additionally, I discovered that in the startup ecosystem, everyone is willing to help you with your dream. All you have to do is believe in yourself and share your idea with others. Before you know it, a team of like-minded people is building it with you.

Slush's Mission

As a member of Slush's core team, I recognize the mission to unite the most relevant individuals in the startup ecosystem, similar to ES's mission of connecting active students.

From LUTES to Slush

Personal Experience

In 2011, after Nokia's fall, we needed to create new job opportunities in Oulu. This led to the founding of OuluES, with a mission to create new deep-tech startups. At the time, no one in Oulu talked about startup entrepreneurship. Our goal was to change that and encourage people to take action.

Building the Startup Ecosystem

With a strong tech understanding in Oulu, we wanted to leverage it to create new tech startups. We now have success stories like Oura. Our first program was a mentoring platform that aimed to connect student entrepreneurs with mentors. After that, we organized many hackathons, pitching events, and matchmaking between investors and startup founders. Additionally, together with the Oulu ecosystem, we built Business Kitchen Oulu, a local co-working space, to show students that they can work alongside corporate leaders.

Personal Growth

When I joined OuluES, I never imagined that I would stay in the startup ecosystem after my studies. However, I spent five years building the Oulu startup ecosystem, and it was a rewarding experience that helped me grow both personally and professionally.

Encouragement

OuluES is an example of how a small community can create a thriving startup ecosystem. I encourage all of you to explore the opportunities available to you and take the first step in your entrepreneurial journey. Who knows, you might just end up creating the next big thing in your community!

Personal Experience

In 2011, inspired by the thriving startup community at Aalto University, a group of friends and I founded JKLES in Jyväskylä to bring like-minded people together and build the next big thing.

Organizational Roles

As a founding member of JKLES, I have played a crucial role in connecting students to local entrepreneurs and building a supportive community. Initially, we used our own resources to fund our activities, but after a year, universities (JAMK & JYU) recognized the impact of entrepreneurship society activities and started supporting us.

Learnings

One of our most significant successes was organizing a trip to Slush, which inspired us to bring similar events to Jyväskylä. Through JKLES, I met my future co-founder and learned that entrepreneurship societies can be a valuable platform for building lasting connections and partnerships.

Impact of ES

Entrepreneurship societies have the potential to create a significant impact locally and nationally with low costs and high impact. Our experience with JKLES has shown that these societies can foster innovation, inspire young entrepreneurs, and build a supportive community that empowers startups to succeed.

Takeaway

By providing a platform for like-minded individuals to connect and collaborate, these societies can support the growth of successful startups and inspire the next generation of entrepreneurs.



Founding Jyväskylä Entrepreneurship Society (JKLES)

Former CEO of Slush, Co-Founder of VES

Personal Experience

When I first traveled to Vaasa, I discovered that there was no Entrepreneurship Society. I already knew all the cool things that Aaltoes was building, so as a freshman, I and a small group of other entrepreneurially minded people decided to build our own ES organization in Vaasa. There was a clear need – we had 50 people coming to our first event without any marketing.

Organizational Roles

Everything starts with a common vision of what we do. In the early days of VES, it was "We help to create a spark not just in business but life in general". My goal in VES was to inspire people to build new things and help them with that.

Learnings

The success of ES is really hard to measure after one year. Instead, we have to look at where previous team members are now. For example, we can see what the board from five years ago has created since they left the ES.

Tips for Future ES boards

The biggest tip I can give is to ensure that all activities inspire the board and team members. If a previous program doesn't excite you, stop doing it and think about where you get most excited. If it's organizing an excursion to Silicon Valley, DO IT.



Reflections on Founding VES

Personal Experience

As a former President of Aaltoes, I gained first-hand experience in building cross-functional teams and bringing new things to life, from ideation to launch. Entrepreneurship societies are the ideal place to experience setbacks and gain valuable lessons, ultimately increasing the chances of success in future endeavors. Setbacks are inevitable, but they provide the best learning opportunities.

Learnings

From my time at Aaltoes and as an entrepreneur-in-residence at Lifeline Ventures, I've learned that hands-on experience is the best way to learn. While learning from those who have done it before you can be helpful, ultimately, no one knows your business better than you do. So, I encourage everyone to just start building.

Success Stories

My time at Aaltoes and Lifeline Ventures inspired me to become a founder. There is nothing quite like the feeling of building your own company. Despite the stress that often comes with entrepreneurship, I find it to be a deeply rewarding experience. The sense of gratitude that comes with creating something from scratch is truly unparalleled.

Takeaway

I strongly believe that anyone can become a successful startup entrepreneur, regardless of their starting point, as long as they possess certain characteristics like resilience and the right amount of stubbornness. It all comes down to believing in yourself and of course, putting in the hard work.









